Personal, Social & Humanities Education (PSHE) KLA and the Liberal Studies Department jointly organised board exhibitions and booth games on the theme, 'Basic Law'. The outside-classroom, student-centred learning activities were aligned with part of the LS and PSHE curriculum.

Whilst some departments operated stalls and booths, others chose to encourage learning in more competitive environments. The Mathematics Department organized "Math Quiz" in the school hall. Quizzes were prepared and arranged for every form on different dates. Questions in the quiz were different from those found in everyday textbooks. There were diverse questions and activities such as Mathematical Olympiad Challenges, Sudoku, Tangram, etc. Students were not only encouraged to focus on the results of the competitions, they were also urged to cooperate with others to achieve specific outcomes..
